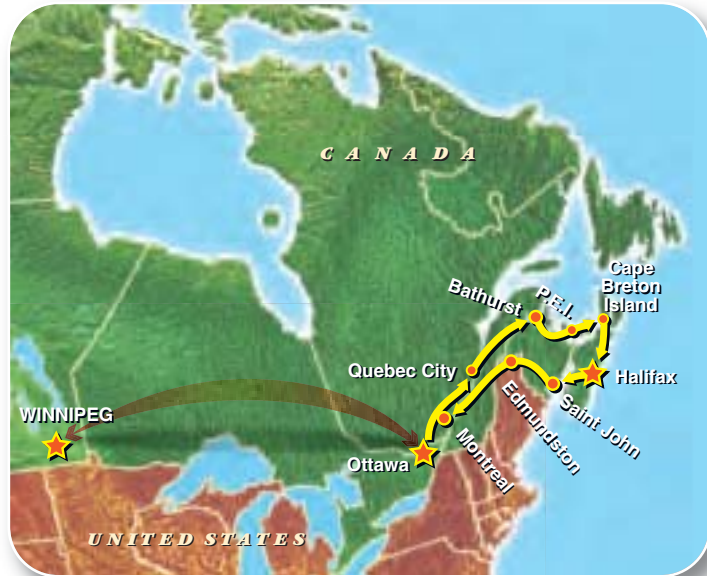

Day 1 Winnipeg – Ottawa (2 nights)

Your Maritimes – New England Tour begins with a relaxing flight to Ottawa. Enjoy the beauty of the east as you travel to Ottawa where you'll spend 2 nights in the nation's capital.

Day 2 Ottawa Area

A **GUIDED TOUR** of **OTTAWA** will include Parliament Hill, the Rideau Canal, and driving by the homes of the Prime Minister and the Governor General. On your free afternoon enjoy a boat cruise on the Rideau Canal or shopping at Byward Market.

Day 3 Ottawa – Quebec City (2 nights)

A short drive along the scenic Ottawa River to **MONTREAL**, where a **GUIDED TOUR** will highlight **NOTRE DAME BASILICA, ST. JOSEPH'S ORATORY AND HISTORIC OLD MONTREAL**. The scenic north shore of the St. Lawrence River is our route as we pass through Trois Rivières for a 2 night stay in North America's oldest walled city.

Day 4 Quebec City Area

This morning step into history as a **GUIDED TOUR** reveals the landmarks of

the French regime, including the Plains of Abraham, and Place Royale. The afternoon is free to explore the shops and quaint cafes in old Quebec. This evening we will enjoy a traditional French Canadian meal at a **SUGAR SHACK** on the Ile d'Orleans. (D)

Day 5 Quebec City – Bathurst

Today follow the scenic southern shore of the St. Lawrence River, with a stop in St. Jean-Port-Joli to see the famous woodcarvers. Then it is on to New Brunswick for the evening.

Day 6 Bathurst – Prince Edward Island (2 nights)

Enjoy striking views as we take a morning drive in **FUNDY NAT'L PARK**. You'll stop at **HOPEWELL ROCKS**, home of the world's highest tides and see the 'Flowerpot Rocks', peculiar rock formations, which are forested islands at high tide and 'Flowerpots' at low tide. Then on to **MAGNETIC HILL** in Moncton; Canada's 3rd most visited natural attraction, where vehicles appear to defy gravity. Your journey continues across the **CONFEDERATION BRIDGE** to P.E.I. This is the world's longest continuous multi-span bridge.

Day 7 Prince Edward Island Area
A FULL DAY GUIDED TOUR IN P.E.I. reveals its rustic charm, including fabled **ANNE OF GREEN GABLES HOME**, **CAVENDISH BEACH**, and the quaint fishing village of North Rustico. See the rich red potato producing soil. In the capital **CHARLOTTETOWN**, visit **PROVINCE HOUSE**, where the Fathers of Confederation signed the agreement of 1864. Tonight enjoy one of P.E.I.'s traditional mouth-watering **LOBSTER DINNERS**.(D)

Day 8 Free day in
Prince Edward Island
 Today we'll take you on a beautiful scenic drive to explore more of picturesque PEI. Maybe you'd like to stick your feet in the ocean!

Day 9 Prince Edward Island –
Cape Breton Island
 Depart P.E.I. by ferry across the Northumberland Strait to Pictou, Nova Scotia. After crossing the Canso Causeway you'll visit the **ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL MUSEUM** in Baddeck. Discover the life and passions of one of North America's most prolific inventors.

Day 10 Cape Breton Island Area
 Imagine yourself in the highlands of Scotland as you follow the Cabot Trail, through **CAPE BRETON HIGHLANDS NAT'L PARK**. Magnificent views of rugged coastline make the **CABOT TRAIL** one of North America's most spectacular drives.

Day 11 Cape Breton –
Halifax / Dartmouth
(2 nights)
 Begin the day with a visit to **SHERBROOKE VILLAGE**, a restored lumbering and mining town, located on the rustic east shore of Nova Scotia. If you like 'Road to Avonlea', you'll love Sherbrooke Village. In the early evening you arrive in Halifax, where you can explore the beautifully restored historic properties along the waterfront.

Day 12 Halifax Area
CITADEL HILL is among the many interesting places you visit on your **TOUR OF HALIFAX** today. This afternoon a leisurely drive along the 'Lighthouse Route' to **PEGGY'S COVE**, an authentic 19th century fishing village. Post a letter in its famous lighthouse.



Day 13 Halifax – Saint John
 Travelling via the Annapolis Valley you visit **GRAND-PRÉ NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE**, where Longfellow's 'Evangeline' is immortalized. Then it's on to Canada's oldest incorporated city of Saint John. View the **REVERSING FALLS...** where the Fundy tides force

the Saint John's River to reverse direction.

Day 14 Saint John – Edmundston
 This morning we travel along the Bay of Fundy to St. Andrews-by-The-Sea with a stop here to enjoy a locally **GUIDED TOUR** and visit the quaint little shops. This afternoon we will continue on to Edmundston.

Day 15 Edmundston –
Montreal/Ottawa
 Today we return to the province of Quebec, enjoying the scenic countryside. Tonight we enjoy our last evening together.

Day 16 Montreal/Ottawa – Winnipeg
 Today we will get on the plane for our trip home, after a great adventure.
